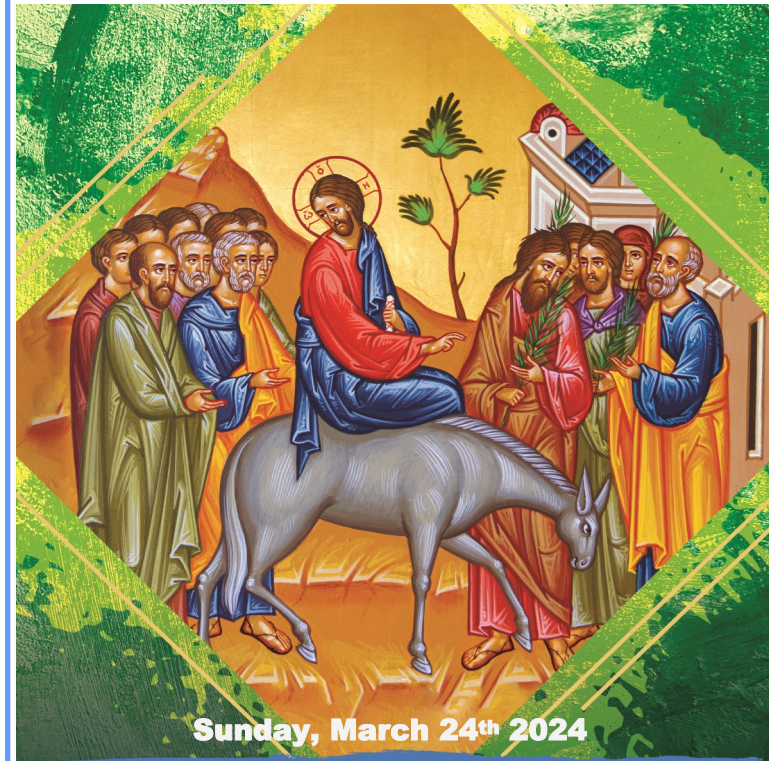

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Whole Story

The Bible is a strange book.

It's one of the only books that most people never read in its entirety, even those who claim it as one of their favorites. It's also one of the only books that we feel comfortable chopping up and sectioning out. There's nothing wrong with that, really, until people start making wholesale judgments of divine revelation based on one tiny part of it. You can't base your belief system on a few lines from Leviticus and ignore the Gospels, just like you can't embrace the teachings of Jesus and ignore the Old Testament. You need to accept the whole story, in its entirety, or none of it means anything. But it's hard, because accepting the whole story means patience. It means critical thinking. It requires endurance. It's easier just to throw a line from Leviticus at a problem and be done with it. Holy Week reminds us that salvation history is a tapestry, not a collection of threads. As beautiful as the individual stitches might be, you won't appreciate the message unless you back up and look at the complete product. If we didn't have the whole story, Holy Thursday and Good Friday would be neither holy nor good. And without Holy Week, Easter morning means nothing — it's just a guy waking up. How often in life do we find ourselves confused to the point of hopelessness, unable to make sense of it all? Overwhelmed by the pain and suffering that exists in this world, and for seemingly no reason. Some of us become so frustrated we throw up our hands and despair.

We need Easter. We need the whole story. We need to be patient. "His disciples did not understand this at first, but when Jesus had been glorified they remembered that these things were written about him and that they had done this for him." — John 12:16—©LPi

(PRACTICANDO) CATÓLICA: RECONOCE A DIOS EN TUS MOMENTOS ORDINARIOS

La Historia Completa

La Biblia es un libro extraño.

Es uno de los únicos libros que la mayoría de la gente nunca lee en su totalidad, incluso aquellos que la consideran uno de sus libros favoritos. También es uno de los únicos libros con los que nos sentimos cómodos cortando y seccionando. En realidad, no hay nada de malo en eso, hasta que la gente comienza a hacer juicios masivos sobre la revelación divina basándose en una pequeña parte de ella. No puedes basar tu sistema de creencias en unas pocas líneas del Levítico e ignorar los Evangelios, del mismo modo que no puedes abrazar las enseñanzas de Jesús e ignorar el Antiguo Testamento. Debes aceptar toda la historia, en su totalidad, o nada de ella significará algo.

Pero es difícil, porque aceptar toda la historia requiere paciencia. Significa pensamiento crítico. Requiere resistencia. Es más fácil simplemente lanzar una línea de Levítico a un problema y terminar de una vez. La Semana Santa nos recuerda que la historia de la salvación es un tapiz, no una colección de hilos. Por más hermosas que sean las puntadas individuales, no apreciarás el mensaje a menos que retrocedas y mires el producto completo. Si no tuviéramos toda la historia, el Jueves Santo y el Viernes Santo no serían ni santos ni buenos. Y sin la Semana Santa, la mañana de Pascua no significa nada: es sólo un hombre despertando. ¿Con qué frecuencia en la vida nos encontramos confundidos hasta el punto de la desesperanza, incapaces de encontrarle sentido a todo? Abrumados por el dolor y el sufrimiento que existe en este mundo, y aparentemente sin motivo alguno. Algunos de nosotros nos frustramos tanto que nos damos por vencidos y nos desesperamos. Necesitamos la Pascua. Necesitamos la historia completa. Necesitamos ser pacientes.

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Saludos desde Ridgecrest: Resumamos con las citas del retiro de los sacerdotes: La siguiente cita es: "Si en algún momento, el Señor nos concede la gracia de imprimir su amor en nuestros corazones, todo se volverá fácil para nosotros, nos llenaremos de gozo y lograremos grandes cosas, todo se volverá fácil para nosotros, nos llenaremos de alegría y lograremos grandes cosas rápidamente y con poco esfuerzo (Santa Teresa de Ávila)". Esta cita se resume en una palabra, contemplación. Estamos llamados a la contemplación. La oración avanzada es contemplación. Para entender la oración contemplativa, debemos entender las otras etapas de la oración. La Tradición cristiana ha conservado tres expresiones principales de la oración: vocal, meditativa y contemplativa (CIC 2699). La oración vocal y meditativa son las formas más comunes de oración. La oración vocal es la oración que se reza en voz alta. Un ejemplo de oración vocal es cuando rezamos la oración del Padre Nuestro en la misa. Otro ejemplo de oración vocal es cuando rezamos el rosario antes de que comience la misa. Además, el rosario es también una forma meditativa de oración. Meditar significa pensar en algo como un misterio y orar por ello. El rosario se reza con misterios. Un ejemplo sería como el misterio de la Anunciación. La persona puede imaginar o visualizar al Arcángel Gabriel anunciando a María que va a concebir y dar a luz un Hijo (Jesús). Se le llama misterio porque está más allá de nuestra comprensión. Esta es la razón por la que la meditación está por encima de la oración vocal. Curiosamente, la mayoría de la gente no entiende la forma más elevada de contemplación de la oración. Dios le da esta forma de oración a la persona. Dios tiene el control. En la oración vocal y meditativa, tenemos el control. Por eso Teresa dice que todo será fácil para nosotros. Nos llenaremos de gozo y lograremos grandes cosas. La contemplación significa que Dios infunde en nosotros su gracia de amor cuando quiere. Es la manera perfecta de alimentar el alma. Todos estamos llamados a esta forma de oración. Si hemos de ser santos, debemos ser contemplativos. La buena noticia es que Dios hace la obra. Simplemente cooperamos con Su gracia. Que nos convirtamos en contemplativos. Dios los bendiga.

Greetings from Ridgecrest: Let us resume with the quotes from the priests' retreat: The next quote is, "If at some time, the Lord should grant us the grace of impressing his love on our hearts, all will become easy for us, we will be filled with joy and we shall accomplish great things will become easy for us, we will be filled with joy and we shall accomplish great things quickly and with little effort (Saint Teresa of Avila)." This quote is summed up in one word, contemplation. We are called to contemplation. Advanced prayer is contemplation. To understand contemplative prayer, we must understand the other stages of prayer. Christian Tradition has retained three major expressions of prayer: vocal, meditative, and contemplative (CCC 2699). Vocal and meditative prayer are the most common forms of prayer. Vocal prayer is prayer that is prayed aloud. One example of vocal prayer is when we pray the Our Father prayer at mass. Another example of vocal prayer is when we pray the rosary before mass starts. Moreover, the rosary is also a meditative form of prayer. Meditation means to think of something like a mystery and pray about it. The rosary is prayed with mysteries. An example would be like the mystery of the Annunciation. The person can imagine or visualize the Archangel Gabriel announcing to Mary that she is to conceive and bear a Son (Jesus). It is called a mystery because it is beyond our understanding. This is why meditation is above vocal prayer. Interestingly, most people don't understand the higher form of prayer contemplation. God gives this form of prayer to the person. God is in control. In vocal and meditative prayer, we are in control. This is why Teresa says that all will become easy for us. We will be filled with joy, and we shall accomplish great things. Contemplation means that God infuses in us His grace of love when He wants. It is the perfect way to feed the soul. We are all called to this form of prayer. If we are to be saints, we must be contemplatives. The good news is that God does the work. We just cooperate with His grace. May we become contemplatives. God bless.
